- **3.** Judge Kennelly announces Scott Patterson is here and going to give a brief review of the SIMS mapping training we did
- 4. Scott thanks everyone who participated in the training
 - i. One main point that came out of Colfax/Union was making everyone that participated aware of all the services available in our rural community.
 - ii. Colfax/Union came up with 45 gapped areas that need growth in the community.
- iii. Speaks as to the community needing more integration with law enforcement
- iv. Behavioral Health Sub-Committee will be producing a report of the training
- **5.** James Lobb speaks to attending a meeting with Invenergy and speaking about a lack of our BH services. They are interested in providing funding for the communities
- **6.** Judge Kennelly speaks as to what our subcommittee has been up too.
 - i. Paul with Rain received 45,000 grant to develop the ECHO project
 - ii. 8th Judicial district court has applied and received a grant to start a behavioral Health Track within the drug court program.
- iii. We meet every 4th day of the month and everyone is welcome to come. Scott Patterson has been helping out with the sub committee
- 7. Judge Kennelly introduces Derek Chin to speak of his grant expansion
 - i. Derek Chin introduces himself and shows a power point of his grant expansion
 - ii. Crime Reduction Grant 2,000,000 will be split between multiple projects
- iii. Does an overview of eligible programs
- iv. Evidence based treatment and supervision alternatives to incarceration programs
- v. Pre-prosecution diversion or specialty programs

- vi. Coordination between law enforcement agencies and treatment programs
- vii. Transitional or re-entry home for individuals recently released from incarceration.
- viii. Law enforcement crisis intervention teams.
- ix. Data driven policing programs
- x. Staff a Criminal Justice Coordinating Council.

8. Grantee Requirements

- i. Grantees are responsible for quarterly and annual reporting, using or developing evidence based practices, and individual level data collection.
- ii. NMSC can help with developing these requirements in a way that makes sense for your project.
- iii. Provides examples of things they have used funding for in past (Community garden, recreation center memberships, and supply closet with free toiletries)

9. Other requirements

- i. Recipients must allocate no more than 5% of the grand administrative costs (service fees, financial work, etc.)
- ii. Recipients are required to provide program data to NMSC, including participant's names and other identifiers for evaluation purposes.
- iii. Recipients are strongly encouraged to use evidence based programs.
